- *I learnt Italian / Romanian / Finnish words and about their daily lives.*

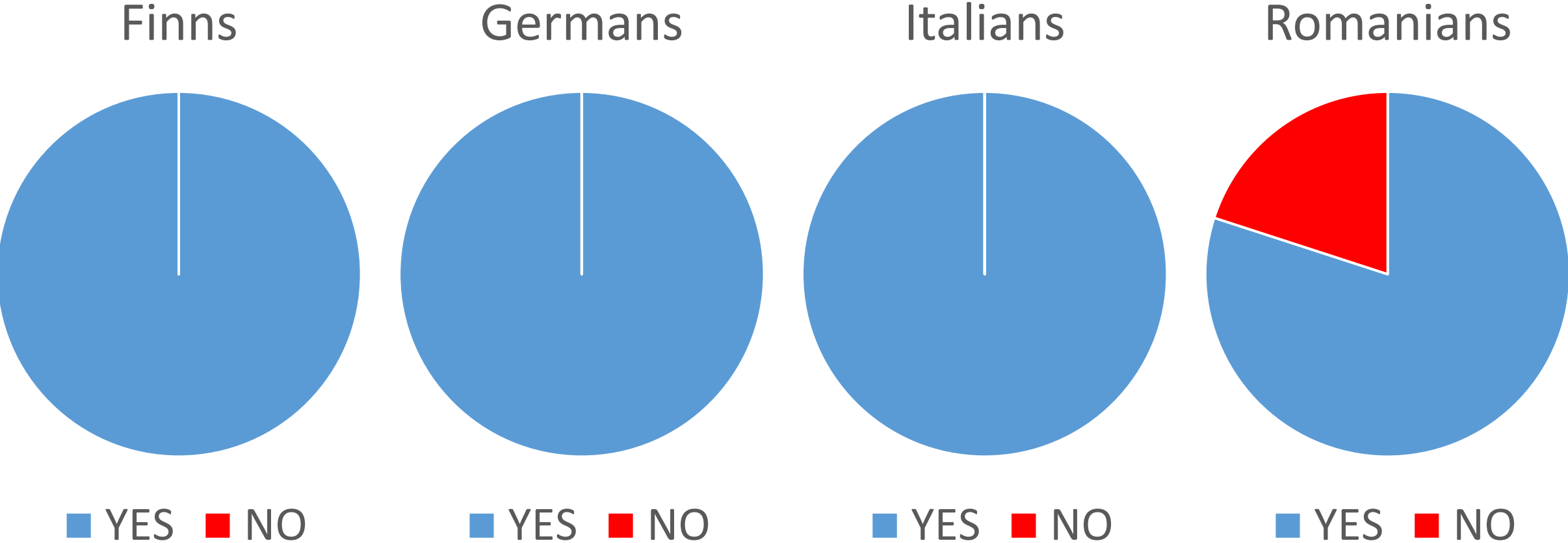
